

Formalities and structure of the thesis at PSI

Citation

Unless you receive other instructions from your supervisor, you are expected to decide independently on a scientific citation standard and to follow it consistently.

Recommended: Harvard Referencing Guide: In addition to the citation regulations, it also contains useful information for students such as how to deal with other people's ideas, plagiarism, etc.

Gender-sensitive language

We recommend that you take both women and men into account when formulating your academic work. Please avoid the generic masculine.

Binding:

- Book binding
- Spine: Name
- Book cover "Final thesis subject-specific psychoanalysis at PSI", name

Cover

- Title of the thesis
- unique designation "Abschlussarbeit Fachspezifikum Psychoanalyse" with the date/year of completion for K2
- Indication of the Psychoanalytic Seminar Innsbruck
- Names of the author
- Names of the two supervisors and the main supervisor
- Place and year

Font and margins

The formal layout of your paper is up to you, but please make sure that it is clearly laid out and take the following standards into account:

Font: Times New or Arial (text)

Font size: 12 (text)

Line spacing: 1.5 points (text)

Page margins: Left 3cm; right 2 cm, top and bottom 2.5cm

Pages must be numbered in the footer!

Three bound print copies and one digital copy will be provided to the PSI.

Assurance

The paper contains a page with the following declaration and your signature at the end:

I hereby certify that I have written this thesis independently and have not used any sources or aids other than those indicated. All passages taken verbatim or in spirit from publications have been marked as such. The thesis has not been submitted in the same or a similar form to any other examination authority.

Preface / Introduction, "Thanks

Summary of contents

1. initial contact, mode of referral

2. initial interview (transference and counter-transference, scenic events)

3. anamnesis, biographical and initial diagnostic considerations

4. course of the process

- Description of the setting
- Phases: 1, 2, 3, 4 with headings and hourly information

for the individual phases:

→ Description of content

→ transference

→ Countertransference (assumption of roles), which interventions the therapist derives from this, further diagnostic insights

→ Psychodynamics

5. summary

- What has changed in the patient's clinical picture?
- What has the therapist learned from this, or what would he/she do differently in the meantime and retrospectively?
- Description and reflection of the psychoanalytic treatment technique in process
- (Post-therapeutic phase)
- Final diagnosis, e.g. according to ICD11 and DSM4 and OPD
